CODE OF CONDUCT

Redlands Rugby League Club is dedicated to encouraging, developing and supporting its players to enjoy the game of rugby league.

All members, associate members, financial members, players, volunteers and spectators are asked to abide by the Redlands Rugby League Club Code of Conduct.

- Respect the rules, referee decision, team-mates and players from the opposition
- Demonstrate sportsmanship
- Make it positive or its pointless, never engage in disrespectful conduct of any sort including aggressive behavior, profanity, sledging, obscene gestures, offensive remarks, trash-talking, taunting or other actions that are demeaning to other players, officials or supporters
- Bullying will not be tolerated
- Condemn all violent or illegal acts, whether by players, coaches, officials, parents or spectators
- Care for and respect the facilities and equipment made available to you during training and competition
- Players are to participate for their own enjoyment and benefit, remember this is a community rugby league not the NRL
- Safeguard your health; don't use any illegal or unhealthy substances
- Do not bet or otherwise financially speculate, directly or indirectly, on the outcome or any other aspect of a Rugby League match or competition in which you are involved
- Follow the directions of the Ground Manager and/or other duty officials
- Ensure alcohol is only consumed in designated licensed area, no alcohol can be taken onto licensed premises
- No smoking or vaping will be permitted at Redlands Rugby League Club (smoking is only permitted off-site behind change sheds)
- No fixed recordings of junior or senior games
- No domestic pets are to enter Redlands Rugby League premises
- Please treat volunteers with respect at all times.

If any member, associate member, financial member, player, volunteer or spectator is reported to have breached the Code of Conduct they will be suspended from attending any training, games or Redlands premises until the matter is addressed by the Club's Complaints Resolution Committee.

The consequences of being found guilty of any breach may include, but is not limited to suspension from training, playing and attending matches. Refunds will not be offered to players that have been found guilty of a breach.
